I. Course Catalog Description

Participants will learn decision making models, principles of organizational hierarchy, and how organizations are impacted by leadership styles. Participants will analyze how their own leadership behavior impacts others through 360- degree feedback.

- Discus how theories of organizational structure/behavior relate to actual business practices.
- Develop strategies for diagnosing the organizational context and why doing so is significant.
- Explain the implications of organizational structure, climate and culture on an organization.
- Describe ways in which organizational change can affect all aspects of the organization from the individual to the group to the overall structure and culture.

At the end of the course, learners may vary in their ability to achieve these outcomes. You are more likely to achieve these outcomes only if you attend class and/or online activities as required by the syllabus, complete the requirements for all assignments to the best of your ability, participate actively in class activities and group work as directed, and study diligently for exams.
