Graduation Requirements

1. Complete the specific program requirements for the master's program
2. Have an overall grade point average of 3.0, with no grade below a C (2.0)
3. Complete a minimum of 36 credit hours

Program Description

The Master of Education Special Education Low-Incidence Disabilities is designed for those who wish to earn an endorsement in special education as part of their graduate degree. A minimum of 36 credit hours is required for the graduate degree. Endorsement in low incidence disabilities may be earned with 33 credit hours. A minimum of nine credit hours is required for a provisional endorsement. EDUC 512 Action Research must be completed within the first 15 credit hours of the program of study.

Admission Process

1. Complete graduate application forms
2. Provide current resume
3. Submit two professional letters of recommendation (at least one from a current or former employer)
4. Turn in one-page personal essay
5. Submit official transcript from a bachelor's degree-granting institution.
6. Be a current, licensed teacher and provide a copy of your teaching license
7. Employer commitment form
