Graduation Requirements

- 1. Complete the specific program requirements for the master's program
- 2. Have an overall grade point average of 3.0, with no grade below a C (2.0)
- 3. Complete a minimum of 36 credit hours

Program Description

The master of education with a major in special education low-incidence disabilities is designed for those who wish to earn an endorsement in special education as part of their graduate degree. A minimum of 36 hours is required for the graduate degree. Endorsement in low incidence disabilities may be earned with 33 credit hours. A minimum of 9 credit hours is required for a provisional endorsement. EDUC 512 Action Research must be completed within the first 15 credit hours of the program of study.

Admission Requirements

Applicants are required to submit:

- 1. Graduate application forms
- 2. Current resume
- 3. Two professional letters of recommendation (at least one from a current or former employer)
- 4. One-page personal essay
- 5. An official transcript from the bachelor's degreegranting institution (applicants must have a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution or higher learning and have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- 6. Be a current, licensed teacher
