#### **COURSE SYLLABUS**

## I. Course Catalog Description

Introduction to Psychology explores the major perspectives, principles, theories, and methods that govern the study of mental processes and behaviors. You will trace psychology's historical roots, scientific basis, and major perspectives. In addition, you will consider contemporary and historical theories of how biological, cognitive, and environmental factors underlie and influence human development, sensation and perception, consciousness, intelligence, and social dynamics. This course also will introduce you to the theories and processes essential to learning, memory, motivation, and personality. Additionally, you will identify psychological disorders and their treatments, and discuss application of psychological principles to everyday experiences and real-life examples. Three credit hours.
