Realizing this goal requires effective leadership and management from those with operations-specific knowledge and skills. The Bachelor of Science in operations management program provides learners the opportunity to develop competencies in operations management practices some of which include logistics management, workforce and performance management, quality and risk management, supply chain management, negotiation and conflict resolution, and data analysis and reporting. Emphasis is also placed on operations management as an organizational strategy and the ethical, legal, and socially responsible behaviors expected of operations managers. Throughout the program, learners are offered opportunities to explore the application of operations management in different service and manufacturing industries, and they select one type of organization and/or industry as a focus for their Capstone project. Graduates have practical, marketable operations management knowledge and skills grounded in industry-accepted theories and practices to help them enter and/or progress in a competitive job market, while building a solid theoretical foundation for potential graduate studies.

Hours from CLEP and DANTEs tests may be included in that 6 hour requirement if transcribed by a previously attended institution. Additional CLEP and DANTEs hours (up to 30 credit hours) may be used for elective credit if transcribed by Southwestern College.</p> <p>-Full credit is given for hours on a CCAF transcript up to a maximum of 64 hours of college credit.</p> <p>*Any College Math that is accepted as part of the completed CCAF degree will be accepted as a Foundation Course. However, certain upper division required courses require College Algebra as a prerequisite and must be fulfilled prior to the requisite course enrollment.</p> <p>**Lower Division Academic Courses: Any lower division academic courses will satisfy this requirement. Air University ABC learners are encouraged to take courses in an area of interest for their major field of study.</p> <p>***Upper Division Major-Related Electives: Any academic courses from an accredited baccalaureate degree granting institution will satisfy these electives or they may be completed with Southwestern College. Air University ABC learners are encouraged to take courses in an area of interest for their field of study.
