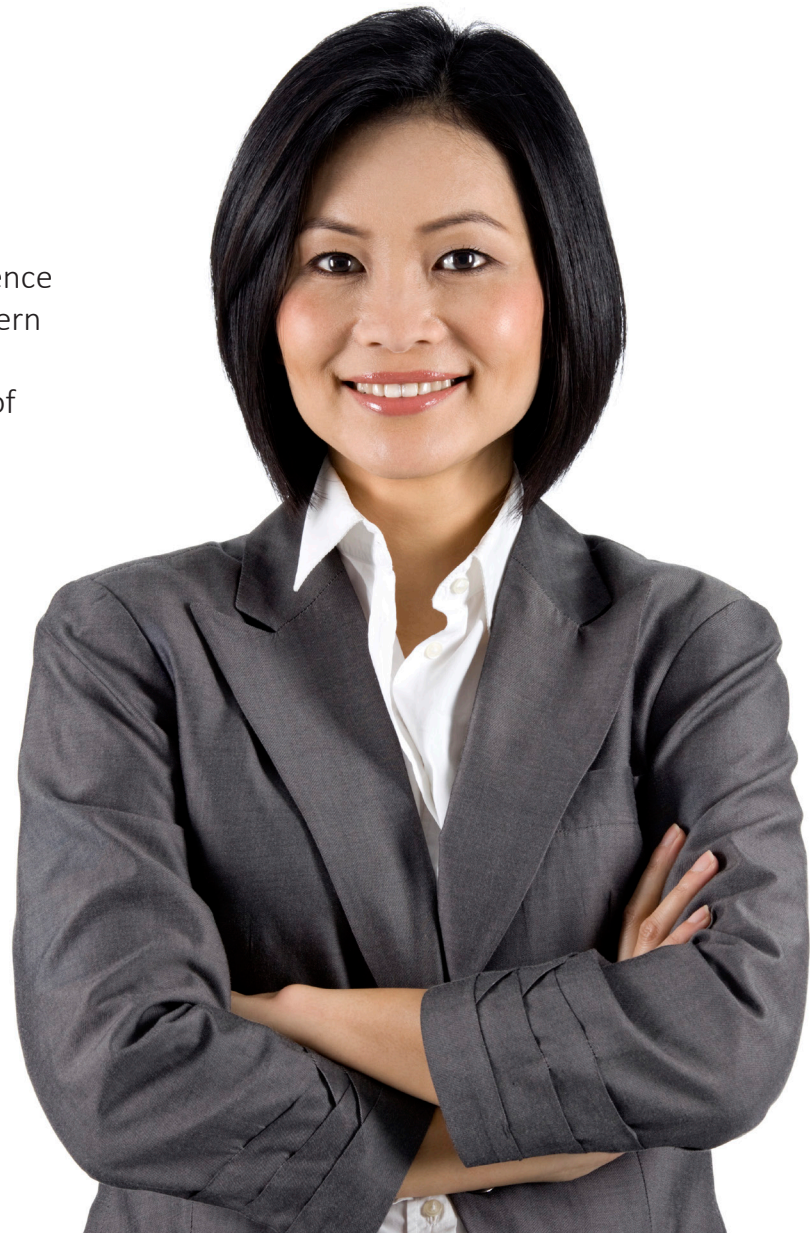

Graduation Requirements

1. Complete the specific program requirements for the master's program
2. Have an overall grade point average of 3.0, with no grade below a C (2.0)
3. Complete a minimum of 36 credit hours

Program Description

The Master of Education with a major in Special Education High-Incidence Disabilities Program at Southwestern College is designed for those who wish to earn an endorsement in teaching special education as part of their graduate degree. A minimum of 36 hours are required for the graduate degree. An endorsement in high incidence disabilities may be earned in 33 credits hours. A minimum of 9 credits is required for a provisional endorsement. EDUC 512 Action Research must be completed within the first 15 credit hours of the program of study.

Admission Process

1. Complete graduate application forms
2. Provide current resume
3. Submit two professional letters of recommendation (at least one from a current or former employer)
4. Turn in one-page personal essay
5. Submit official transcript from the bachelor's degree-granting institution.
6. Be a current, licensed teacher and provide a copy of your teaching license
7. Employer commitment form
